Have you started thinking about how you will pay those winter heating bills? Perhaps you are eligible for one of the heating assistance programs described in this month's newsletter. The first one is the LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Program) administered through Action, Inc. in Gloucester and the other is The Salvation Army Good Neighbor Fund Program. Please review the

income eligibility guidelines to see if you or someone you know may qualify for this assistance.

Also, I just want to encourage everyone to consider attending the exciting programs and events being offered this month through the Hamilton COA.

FUEL ASSISSTANCE PROGRAMS and ELIGIBILITY

There are two heating assistance programs available to income eligible households.

First, there is Action, Inc. in Gloucester, Massachusetts which administers the Federal LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program). Please call Action, Inc. at 978-281-3900 for information to apply as well as through their online application portal. Action, Inc. also provides additional heating programs beyond paying for heating bills with their weatherization and burner replacement services.

The Salvation Army of Massachusetts is offering the Good Neighbor Fund Program to eligible households as well with up to \$500 in assistance on heating and certain utility bills. The income guidelines for both programs are shown below. If you feel you are eligible for The Salvation Army Good Neighbor Program, please contact Tim Morris, Social Service Coordinator at the Hamilton COA at 978-468-5595 to apply or ask for more information. Keep warm and active during these upcoming cold New England winters.


