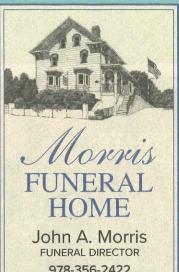

I was just thinking...

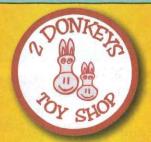
about baseball, now that the first pitch of the new season is history. When he was being considered for the presidency of Yale University, Bart Giamatti responded that the only presidency that appealed to him was that of the American League. After he served as Yale's President, he became the Commissioner of Baseball. In his book, Take Time for Paradise, he refers to baseball as the consummate "metaphor of American life." He muses that baseball, in its ideal form, is timeless. Further, it reveals the tension between order and freedom and thrives on intuition amid the geometry of the diamond and the calculus of balls. strikes and outs. Al-though stealing occurs it is subject to a penalty-being thrown out. Nevertheless, each inning is laden with opportunities for redemption. Ultimately Giamatti asks the reader to reflect on the notion that baseball's goal is "to come home." For him "going home is where the restoration of right relations among people and things occurs because that is where it matters most." While Giamatti reveals his romantic affection for baseball, he suggests that love prompts a person to not only "come home" but be at home. Something to think about.

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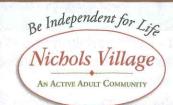
