Now is the time to reevaluate your Prescription Plan, which should be done every year. As a reminder, Prescription plans change from year to year, medications that you are taking may no longer be covered or they might be a higher tier from the previous year. This is the time you can make the changes to your Prescription Plan. Appointments can be made starting on September 23rd, and will be limited this year. Open enrollment officially starts on October 15th.

Additionally, we have a lot of fun programs coming in September. We are planning a Back to School Ice Cream Social, National Cheese Pizza Day Lunch, a Magician, and National Swap Ideas Day. Please make sure that you make reservations, if you are planning to come to the events. 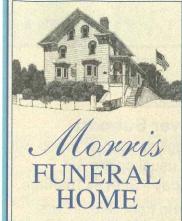

I was just thinking...

about the words "All gave some; some gave all." It is attributed to Howard Ostercamp, a soldier who fought "the Forgotten War" in Korea and received the Purple Heart. At first glance, it is a commentary on military history. However, the words are applicable to our life together as families, communities and countries. The words beckon us to engage with others in ways that are self forgetful and non-transactional. Twenty-three years ago on a beautiful September Day thousands of people were beginning their day's activities. In a little over an hour 2,996 people died when planes crashed into The NYC Trade Towers, The Pentagon in DC and a field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. On September 11, 2001 many brave people gave their all for the good of others. Bruce Springsteen in his album The Rising sings, "Into The Fire." It is a song that embodies self forgetfulness. The hundreds of volunteers who worked on "The Pile" but succumbed to the toxic elements buried in the debris gave their all. The hearts of thousands who were affected by 9 -11 have been tattooed with compassion for others who are in distress. All gave some: some gave all.
