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

Pursuant to the Open Meeting Law, MGL Chapter 30 A, §§ 18-25, written notice posted by the Town Clerk delivered to all Select Board members, a meeting of the Hamilton Select Board was posted for August 19, 2024 at 7:00pm. This meeting was held at the Hamilton Wenham Library, 14 Union Street.

The Select Board functions as the Chief Executive body of the Town. Its five members are elected to three-year terms with one or two seats up for election each year. The Board acts as the chief policy making body of the Town and directly supervises the activities of the Town Manager. The Select Board typically meets the first and third Monday evening at 7:00 p.m. Select Board: Caroline Beaulieu (2025); Thomas Myers (2025); Bill Wilson (2026); William Olsen (2027); Rosemary Kennedy (2027).

Call to order: Chair Beaulieu called the meeting to order at 7:02pm. Present: C. Beaulieu, Chair, B.Wilson, Vice-Chair, , R.Kennedy, W. Olsen. Not present: T.Myers, Clerk. Also present: Joseph J. Domelowicz Jr., Town Manager; and others as noted.

The Chair announced Board and Committee openings as displayed on the agenda:

Select Board Member Reports:

- R.Kennedy noted the Conservation Commission meeting was unfortunately cancelled. The Council on Aging elected new officers at their last meeting, Laura Studley was elected as the chair. On August 15, she joined the tour of the Manchester-by-the-Sea elementary school organized by the Superintendent. She shared some of her observations of the school.
- B.Wilson noted the Athletic Fields Project is well underway and on track to be complete in summer of 2025. The School building committee is working on drawings and schematics.
- Chair Beaulieu noted the Board of Health adopted new regulations on the keeping of animals, and the septic loan program will be coming on line. She noted that residents have been asking her how they can engage with Utile directly, she asked that residents send an email to her or to the Town Manager and they will connect people to the consultants directly.
- J.Domelowicz provided an update on the status of the Ipswich River and water usage, and noted the river is only at 14.1 cubic feet of discharge, the bylaws require enforcement of restrictions at 52.5 cubic feet, and therefore the restrictions should stay in place.

Public Comment - Three (3) minutes per person on items not already on the agenda

Deb Safford, Maple St, encouraged the Select Board to work with the School Committee to have a second option to vote on for the School Building Project at the Town Meeting. She also asked that there be options provided from Utile for the Town Meeting votes on downtown, so that the different issues can be voted on separately. Chair Beaulieu explained that only one school option can be presented to the Town per the state process.

Consent Agenda:

• Approve Tour de Greenbelt event through Hamilton Vote: The Board voted unanimously to approve the consent agenda.

Agenda:

 Report - Town Clerk Carin Kale to discuss election deadlines & events & recommend Early Voting hours – Discuss & Vote

Town Clerk C.Kale reported the State primary is September 3, and the presidential election on November 5. The state primary warrant must be posted by August 27, and requires a Select Board vote to approve. She also requested Board approval for early voting hours for the November 5 election, which includes two weeks of early voting. She recommended 4.5 hours of voting per day for the first week, and full office hours for the second week. Only 8% of voters typically engage in early voting. The deadline to register to vote in the November election is August 24. Voters can vote by mail, early in person, or in person on election day. All is going well with the September 3 state primary, please remember to return vote by mail ballots.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously to approve the early voting hours for Town Hall.

Review request for sale of Cemetery plot to former resident – Discuss & Vote

A former Hamilton resident now living in Peabody is requesting to purchase a family plot together with her family's plot. There was some discussion about the size of the plot as a family plot, and whether all people to be buried there have sufficient ties to Hamilton and if that is acceptable. R.Kennedy disagreed with the idea of additional family members without their own ties to Hamilton being buried in the cemetery.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously to approve Cynthia Ginsburg's request to purchase a cemetery plot.

• Review Final Draft Amicus Brief in case Attorney General versus Town of Milton - Discuss & Vote

KP Law attorneys Tom McEnaney (in person) and Jonathan Murray (zoom) were present to discuss the current draft of the amicus brief. They thanked the Board for the comments they had received and incorporated it into the brief. There was discussion about including more details in the brief or keeping it to the larger issues. J.Murray responded the legal arguments are more important relative to what the court has asked for, and the cost implications for the town are less relevant. If the Town wants specifics, he just needs the actual citation to include as a reference. A few more specific edits were raised by the Board, J.Murray will make the edits requested and return the next draft by the beginning of the following week. The attorneys advised that the Town should be prepared to file by the end of the month, to ensure that the deadline is not missed.

Review Draft Warrant for September 23, 2024 Special Town Meeting - Discuss & Vote

Attorney McEnaney explained there is one general article for reports, and two financial articles, one to appropriate funds from the Community Preservation Committee (CPC), and one to appropriate general town funds. B.Wilson noted the amount of CPC funding being proposed will constrain their activities for some time going forward. John McGrath of the Finance Committee discussed some of the history and financial detail of the project and how it can be explained to the Town. The Finance Committee will write up the history to include in the book of recommendations. The Finance Committee also digested the specifics of the decarbonization project, which needs to be explained to the Town as well.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously to approve the addition of the specific amount of \$1.5 to be allocated from the CPC for the Town Hall Project as outlined in the warrant article 20249 2-1.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously to recommend favorable action on article 20249 2-1.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously to update the language in warrant article 20249 2-2 as presented.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously to recommend favorable action on article 20249 2-2.

New Business:


R.Kennedy requested the new Hero Act signed by the Governor includes further abatements for veterans, and she would like this to come back for further discussion. J.Domelowicz noted there is more forthcoming from the state on the specifics, and it should be ready for the spring Town Meeting. Attorney McEnaney noted the state has approved accessible dwelling units by right, and this will require some bylaw reviews.

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Call to order: Chair Beaulieu called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Present: C. Beaulieu, Chair, B.Wilson, Vice-Chair, , R.Kennedy, T.Myers, Clerk (via zoom), W. Olsen (joined the meeting at approximately 7:30 via zoom). Also present: Joseph J. Domelowicz Jr., Town Manager; and others as noted.

Select Board Member Reports:

- B.Wilson the School Committee met recently, on February 6th -they will approve their final budget, there will be some quintuple Board meetings again as part of the budget process. The Athletic Fields project is moving along and is on track for completion in August. The school will submit the elementary school design to the MSBC.
- Chair Beaulieu conversations continue with Gordon Conwell Seminary regarding the sale of the apartments, discussions are moving along well and have been very positive.
- J.Domelowicz the Town Manager's report will be out on Friday.

Public Comment - Three (3) minutes per person on items not already on the agenda

- Jeff Austin, Sharon Rd., asked if the Board and the HDC have considered waiting until next year to proceed with the Form-based Code until after the Judicial Supreme Court rules on 3A. Chair Beaulieu replied, discussing the challenge of fully separating the two.
- Tosh Blake, Sagamore St. quoted from state law and pointed out that the Form-based Code cannot thwart compliance in terms of density and size. He opined Form-based Code does nothing to mitigate the 3A regulations.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the consent agenda.

JOINT MEETING WITH HAMILTON DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Chair Mitchell opened the meeting of the Hamilton Development Corporation.

Present: Rick Mitchell, Chair, Angela Arvanites, Scott Maddern. Not present: Brian Stein.

Request Select Board to approve re-appointment of Chad Smith to the Hamilton Development Corporation Discuss & Vote

Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the re-appointment of Chad Smith to the Hamilton Development Corporation.

Request Select Board support recommendation of Meals Tax Revenue to Hamilton Development Corporation during budget development - Discussion

Chair Mitchell requested the Select Board enact a policy to ensure the meals tax is appropriated in its entirety to the HDC every year. It had been done so for many years, and has seemed to change in the last few years and the appropriated amount has been reduced. HDC is requesting a policy for the full amount to be credited in arrears, once the full amount is known in the fiscal year. The Finance Committee has fully reviewed and is supportive of such a policy. R.Kennedy argued there is no mandate for the Town of Hamilton to give the meals tax revenue to the HDC. S.Maddern pointed out this is by law of the State that the meals tax should pass through the Town to the HDC. J.Domelowicz clarified this policy was adopted at a prior Town Meeting, but it does not necessarily obligate future Town Meetings to vote the same. R.Kennedy stated there is a lot of controversy about giving this funding to the HDC, especially when they are not a Town entity. Chair Mitchell disagreed, stating there has not been a lot of controversy, and the HDC is a Town entity by statute and a public non-profit. Chair Beulieu summarized the policy entails the prior year receipts are used for budgeting purposes for HDC, but they are not codifying the money necessarily goes to the HDC.

Scheduling/Timing of Town Meeting consideration of Downtown Form Based Zoning and 3A Zoning articles Discussion

Chair Mitchell discussed the HDC is contributing \$33,000 to the Form-based Code development and HDC is concerned the Form-based Code exercise is getting intimately tied to the 3A zoning in the minds of the residents, which is incorrect. The Form-based Code exercise is an aesthetic zoning bylaw designed to standardize the form, shape, size, and location of any new potential development in the future and is designed to be protective of the character of the town. HDC strongly recommends separating the two exercises and not bringing them to Town meeting at the same time. Additionally, to make it clear it is a separate exercise, and avoid wasting the investment in Form-based Code development.

• Request for \$2.5 million in the FY'26 Capital Plan for downtown improvements - Discussion

Following discussions with Finance Committee and the Capital Committee, HDC is requesting some clarity and transparency on how capital requests move from the capital plan and into a capital budget. HDC would like to move forward with improvements to Willow St, Railroad Ave, and Asbury to Bay Rd, to make the downtown more inviting and improve those streets and sidewalks. They are seeking \$2.5 million to be moved into a future capital budget. J.Domelowicz stated budget requests are put forward by Department heads and is reviewed by the Capital Committee and then by the Finance Committee and Select Board. He said the HDC request is in the plan, but he does not know where it will stand relative to all other priorities and competing demands. The Capital Committee will be asked to meet with someone from the HDC to discuss the specifics of the request.

Updates to Select Board on:

- o Downtown Wi-Fi A.Arvanites has been working for three or four months at options for Wi-Fi downtown. B.Wilson recommended this issue move into a joint RFP process with HDC. The groups agreed to a preliminary meeting to discuss options. o Downtown pocket park HDC has negotiated an agreement with the condo association that owns the property that will grant HDC a license to develop a pocket park. The HDC will fund it at approximately \$150,000.
- o Lampson Oil property This property has been on the market for approximately a year, they have had discussions about purchasing it, but do not have sufficient funding. HDC would like to discuss how to approach these opportunities in the future.
- Deb Safford, Maple St. stated part of the contract for Utile's work included 3A, and it may not be separable. She suggests pausing the Utile work until 3A is settled.
- Lisa Terranova, Woodland Mead, stated the thought of 3A and form-based code being tied together isn't just "pie in the sky" or fearmongering, she claimed that a consultant from Utile stated the form-based code will be written in a way that is 3A compliant, and that is what scares people.
- Ed McCarthy, Cunningham Drive, stated there are many serious infrastructure needs in Town, and it needs 40b compliance, good water infrastructure, water treatment plant improvements, elderly housing, school repair and rejuvenation, etc. He believes 3A and Form-based Code should be the least of our concerns as citizens as Form-based Code is a beautification project of downtown, not infrastructure.
- > Jeff Austin, Sharon Rd., stated that the 20% housing required downtown for 3A will change the character of the downtown no matter how pretty you make it look. If 3A and Form-based Code isn't separated, it is going to fail in April.
- Tosh Blake, Sagamore St., stated officials jumped the gun in terms of moving toward compliance from the beginning and before the public was really informed. He believes this was a big error, and Form-based Code was sold as a way to address 3A, which implies compliance, and this is what people are against. He opined the Form-based Code should have nothing to do with 3A, and they have to be separated.

T.Myers responded by stating that the SJC decision on 3A will come in a few months, and he pointed out that tonight there are a lot of anti-3A people speaking, but he has heard from many people in town who are pro-3A, and assuming the vote on 3A is going to fail is not necessarily true. He stated there are an equal amount of people on both sides of the issue, and the Town needs to be

prepared and should have a plan in place and ready to go. Just because one side is more vocal, does not mean the other side does not exist.

- Steven McQuirter, Cunningham Dr. stated that the Town was told in March to get sewerage to the town from the MWRA would take 25 years. The model to look at is Gordon Conwell has a huge sewerage treatment plant that takes up acres of land.
- Adjournment Vote: The Hamilton Development Corporation voted unanimously to adjourn at approximately 8:26PM.

Update/Report with Town Clerk Carin Kale to discuss November 5, 2024 Election reminders & announcements The Clerk's office is totally focused on the election, there was a great turnout at the poll worker training the previous week. Voters have three ways to vote, vote by mail, vote early in person, or vote on election day. Please return vote by mail ballots as soon as possible as it makes it more efficient for the office to process them earlier. Early voting is at the Patton Homestead for a two-week period through November 1. Election day voting is at the Recreation Center 7:00AM to 8:00PM.
- Select Board signing of the State Election Warrant
 The warrant has to be signed by the Select Board and posted around town by October 29th.
- 2. Presentation of Senior Care programs in Hamilton with Executive Director Scott Trenti Discussion
 S.Trenti presented on programs of Senior Care and the Executive Office of Elder Affairs. He discussed a community transitions liaisons programs that identifies people in nursing homes who would like to return to their community with appropriate supports in place. The biggest barrier to helping people to return to their communities is the lack of affordable housing. Another area they have worked on is technology services for people who may be isolated or struggling with anxiety and so forth, by using technology to provide experiences and tech support to be connected. There is also avatar technology that connects the elder to a health coach. He discussed programs for caregivers to give them outings and experiences around the north shore. He discussed a program through which an elder can be an employer to hire caregivers (excluding spouses) with assistance from the program, which helps to address the severe shortage of available caregivers at many agencies. There is also a volunteer medical transportation service that can help seniors. Senior Care serves elders 60 years of age and above, as well as people with disabilities aged 22 and above.
- 3. Appointment of Bryan Labell to the Hamilton Foundation & appointment of Jill Evers as Hamilton Foundation Coordinator Discuss & Vote

Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the appointment of Bryan Labell to the Hamilton Foundation and appointment of Jill Evers as Hamilton Foundation Coordinator.

4. Review two requests to purchase cemetery plots - Discuss & Vote

The Hart family are seasonal residents of Hamilton in Asbury Grove and are looking to purchase two plots, the other family raised their children in Hamilton but now live in Amesbury (Cider Hill Farm) and would like to be buried here.

The Board deferred action to approve the cemetery plot purchase for the Cook family, pending additional information.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the purchase of cemetery plots by Anne and Daryl Hart.

5. Review FY'26 Budget Goals & Annual Town Meeting Calendar - Town Manager J. Domelowicz - Discuss & Vote The Finance Committee has set much of the same goals as last year, and the budget memo has gone out to department heads. John McGrath of the Finance Committee spoke regarding the School Building Project explaining the State process is very efficient and the information is readily available. The Finance Committee has talked about the financials of the project many times and at a high level, the project is approximately \$150 million in total; the State will contribute \$50 million and the two towns would then cover the rest with a 30-year bond. The financial profile on this school project is extremely attractive to the town, the State contribution is an important asset. Discussion followed, with members of the audience asserting their objections to the School Building Project, until the discussion was curtailed as off topic.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the FY26 budget goals.

- Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the FY26 budget calendar pending some date changes.
- 6. Review new Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA) for Regional Human Resources Discuss & Vote Rockport has informed the Town they will be hiring their own HR person, they will remain in the agreement through December, and thereafter it will be between Hamilton and Manchester by-the-Sea. Hamilton is in the lead in this agreement.

 Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the IMA for Regional Human Resources.
- 7. Review new Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA) for Regional Conservation Agent Discuss & Vote When Hamilton and Manchester first contemplated this shared agreement, Manchester was going to be in the lead, but Hamilton was able to move quicker at the time and took the lead. Now that the Hamilton-hired shared agent has departed, Manchester has

asked to go back in the lead, and will take the lead on hiring the new agent. There will be a reduction from 18 hours/week to 16 hours/week dedicated to Hamilton.

Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the IMA for a Regional Conservation Agent.

8. Review new Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA) for Eastern Essex Regional Public Health Collaborative (EERPHC) - Discuss & Vote

This is a newer Regional Intermunicipal Agreement that includes Hamilton, Wenham, Essex, and Rockport, which is grant funded. The Department of Public Health is requiring this new IMA in order to continue the program, and it must be voted in each town. Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to approve the IMA for the Eastern Essex Regional Public Health Collaborative.

9. FY '25 Town Manager and Select Board Goals Recap - Discussion 10. Recap of September 23, 2024 Special Town Meeting vote - Discussion

These items were deferred to a subsequent meeting.



• Lisa Terranova, Woodland Mead, stated that she identified evidence of how the Town brought together the issue of 3A and form-based code. She stated that the public did not conflate the issues, it was done by the Town. She opined that Article 11 from the 2024 Annual Town Meeting, was not clearly stated as the intent, which amounted to "lack of transparency and gaslighting."

1. Discuss timing of Annual Town Meeting (ATM) Warrant Articles & pause on the Utile downtown form-based code zoning process - Discussion

J.Domelowicz explained that following input from the Hamilton Development Corporation, the public, the Planning Board Chair, and public comment at various meetings, Utile has proposed to pause the form-based code project until the ruling from the Supreme Judicial Court on 3A is completed. They believe there is too much uncertainty around 3A making it difficult to talk

about the form-based code project with Hamilton residents. J. Domelowicz concurred with the recommendation and agreed with the proposed pause on the project. There are still a number of other issues that need to be on the warrant. B.Wilson opined there should still be something on the warrant to allow discussion on these issues and he did not agree with pausing both 3A and form-based code in terms of the ATM. T.Myers stated if the decision from the Supreme Judicial Court (SJC) comes in January, then the Town will not be ready to move forward and was in favor of having something on the ATM agenda. R.Kennedy stated she was in favor of holding on both issues pending the outcome of the SJC decision on Milton. J.Domelowicz expressed the difficulty that Utile has had having conversations with the community on form-based code because of the 3A issues. The Board continued discussing the possibilities of having an article on the warrant and what that might look like. Discussion continued on the pros and cons of various scenarios. There was also discussion regarding what steps to take with the consultants, who do not currently have a plan to present to the town, and the concern the Town is paying for services that are not getting done. It was further noted that Utile has fulfilled their public engagement meetings according to the contracted scope of work, and additional engagement would require additional funding.

Chair Beaulieu emphasized a decision needs to be made regarding the recommendation from Utile. The suggestion was made to invite Utile to the next meeting to have a discussion with the Board, and possibly joint with the Planning Board.

- 2. Approve Select Board January June 2025 meeting calendar Discuss & Vote

 The Board looked briefly at the meeting calendar and discussed a few of the shifts that occurred.

 Vote: The Board voted unanimously by roll call to confirm the Select Board meeting calendar from January through June, 2025.
- 3. FY '25 Town Manager & Select Board Goals (Continued); Communications Planning goals Discussion Chair Beaulieu noted she requested to add communications goals in order to add some clarity for new staff members. Regarding planning for water issues, J.Domelowicz noted he has been appointed to a subcommittee for the Water Resilience Task Force, working on formulating recommendations for water improvements on the North Shore. John McGrath, Chair of the Finance Committee, remarked he would like to devote some time to thinking through the water issues and report on the Finance Committee's perspective to the Town at the ATM in April. The Board discussed that the connectivity issue has shifted from the cell tower to a mesh network to provide better connectivity downtown in particular. There was brief discussion of including goals about digitizing records, finalizing the Master Plan, and recruitment of board and committee members.
- 12. New Business There was none.

Adjournment Vote: The Select Board voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at approximately 8:50PM.

All on-premises M.G.L. c. 138, §12 licensees must provide proof of the required liquor liability insurance and a copy of the required Fire Safety Inspection Certificate to the Local Licensing Authorities. <u>Please do not forward</u> the Fire Safety Certificates, Insurance Certificates, or License Certificates to the ABCC. You should keep these forms for your records.

I am writing this letter on behalf of the Hamilton Select Board, which voted on Monday, December 16, 2024, to confirm that Raymond Brunet, in his capacity as Fire Chief of the Hamilton Fire Department, is an authorized representative of the Select Board and the town with regard to the proposed project to construct an exhibition garage for the Town of Hamilton's Antique Model T Fire Engine on land in front of the Hamilton Public Safety Building.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF HAMILTON AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A MASTER EQUIPMENT LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH RESPECT TO THE ACQUISITION, PURCHASE, FINANCING AND LEASING OF CERTAIN EQUIPMENT OR CAPITAL ITEMS FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; AND AUTHORIZING ALL OTHER ACTIONS NECESSARY TO THE CONSUMMATION OF THE TRANSACTIONS CONTEMPLATED BY THIS RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Town of Hamilton, a body politic and corporate duly organized and existing as a political subdivision of the Town of Hamilton (the "Lessee"), is authorized by the laws of the State of Massachusetts to purchase, acquire and lease personal property for the benefit of the Lessee and its inhabitants and to enter into contracts with respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Lessee desires to purchase, acquire, finance and lease certain equipment with a cost not to exceed \$1,377,371.00 constituting personal property necessary for the Lessee to perform essential governmental functions (the "Equipment"); and

WHEREAS, the Lessee proposes to enter into that certain Master Lease Purchase Agreement and Schedule No. 1 thereto (the "Lease"), with Municipal Leasing Consultants, LLC and/or its assigns (or one of its affiliates) (the "Lessor"), the form of which has been available for review by the governing body of the Lessee prior to this meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Equipment is essential for the Lessee to perform its governmental functions; and

WHEREAS, the funds made available under the Lease will be deposited with pursuant to the terms of that certain Escrow Agreement, among the Lessee, the Lessor and an escrow agent satisfactory to the Lessor and the Lessee (the "Escrow Agreement"; and together with the Lease, the "Financing Documents") and will be applied to the acquisition of the Equipment in accordance with said Escrow Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Lessee has taken the necessary steps, including those relating to any applicable legal bidding requirements, to arrange for the acquisition of the Equipment; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Lessee deems it for the benefit of the Lessee and for the efficient and effective administration thereof to enter into the Financing Documents and any other documentation necessary, convenient or appropriate for the purpose of the financing the Equipment on the terms and conditions described therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE LESSEE AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Lessee is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Financing Documents with principal components of rental payments in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,377,371.00.

Section 2. The Financing Documents and the acquisition and financing of the Equipment under the terms and conditions as described in the Financing Documents are hereby approved. The Town Manager of the Lessee and any other officer of the Lessee with the power to execute contracts on behalf of the Lessee be, and each of them hereby is, authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver the Financing Documents and any and all instruments, documents and certificates which may be required by or provided for in the Financing Documents or as may otherwise be required for or necessary, convenient or appropriate to the financing described in this resolution together with any changes, insertions and omissions therein as may be approved

by the officers who execute the Financing Documents, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by such execution and delivery of the Financing Documents. The <u>Town Manager</u> of the Lessee and any other officer of the Lessee with the power to do so be, and each of them hereby is, authorized to affix the official seal of the Lessee to the Financing Documents and attest the same.

Section 3. The proper officers of the Lessee be, and each of them hereby is, authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all papers, instruments, opinions, certificates, affidavits and other documents and to do or cause to be done any and all other acts and things necessary or proper for carrying out this resolution and the Financing Documents.

Section 4. Pursuant to Section 265(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), the Lessee hereby specifically designates the Lease as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

Section 5. Nothing contained in this resolution, the Lease nor any other instrument shall be construed with respect to the Lessee as incurring a pecuniary liability or charge upon the general credit of the Lessee or against its taxing power, nor shall the breach of any agreement contained in this resolution, the Lease or any other instrument or document executed in connection therewith impose any pecuniary liability upon the Lessee or any charge upon its general credit or against its taxing power, except to the extent that the rental payments payable under the Lease are special limited obligations of the Lessee as provided in the Lease.

Section 6. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 7. All bylaws, orders and resolutions or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed as reviving any bylaw, order, resolution or ordinance or part thereof.

Section 8. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
