Re: Application of New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC d/b/a AT&T ("AT&T") for a Special Permit (the "Application") to Install a Small Wireless Facility to Replacement Pole # 943-84 (the "Pole") in the Public Right-of-Way Near 18 Walnut Road, South Hamilton, MA 01982 (the "Site") (CRAN_RCTB_00073_665) Pursuant to Section 7.3 of the Town of Hamilton Zoning Bylaws (the "Bylaws") – Request for Continuance

Dear Honorable Members of the Town of Hamilton Planning Board:

On behalf of AT&T, while reserving all rights, please accept this letter as our request to continue the upcoming public hearing scheduled for May 20, 2025. As requested by the Planning Board at the last hearing on April 1, 2025, AT&T is working with National Grid to attach the small cell facility on an alternative pole further away from the abutters' homes. The pole we discussed at the hearing as a potential alternative, Pole # 2478 - which is at the corner of Walnut Road and Bay Road - is not available; National Grid will not allow a small cell facility on that pole.

However, there is another pole (Pole 7½) on Walnut Road, the next pole down from Pole #2478 which appears to be available, feasible and acceptable for AT&T's coverage and capacity needs. AT&T is in the process of working through the licensing process with National Grid for pole 7½, but that review and approval process was not completed in time for the hearing on May 20, 2025.

Based on the anticipated timeline to obtain National Grid's approval for the new location, the filing of a new special permit application and the associated public hearing, we respectfully request the hearing for this Application be continued to the Planning Board's meeting on July 15, 2025.

Also, in the spirit of continuing cooperation, please accept this letter as AT&T's request and agreement to extend all applicable decisions and written decision filing deadlines under state, federal and local laws, regulations, ordinances and orders, including the Federal Communications Commission (the "FCC") so called "shot clock" requirements. As you may know, the Application is subject to an FCC "shot clock" of 90 days. With the Board's

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concurrence, please let this letter serve as AT&T's agreement to extend all of said decision deadlines to July 31, 2025 (the "Decision Date"). The Decision Date may be further extended by the written, mutual agreement of the Board and AT&T.

I will attend the hearing on May 20, 2025, via Zoom in the event there are any questions.
